Year of the Coast 2023 celebrates our breath-taking coastline and celebrates a year-long programme of events occurring around the whole of England's coast including various new sections of the England Coast Path opening.

Here are just a few examples as to where you can start your adventure in 2023...

#### Cumbria

An exciting new launch for coastal <u>Cumbria</u>, 'The Edge' is Cumbria's new Coastal Activity Centre, set to open in Whitehaven in July 2023. The cutting-edge venue will provide bespoke water sports, recreational, arts and activity facilities at Whitehaven Harbour, 'the coastal gateway to the Lakes', as well as a community and educational centre for public use. The only centre of its kind on the North West, its fantastic location is at the start of the C2C Cycle Route and will feature new accommodation (17 rooms), food and drinks offering, and viewing platform overlooking the coast.

**Book with England's Coast:** Stay in Whitehaven at <u>Summergrove Halls</u>, a hotel nestled amongst beautiful gardens with easy access to the Cumbrian Coast and Western Lakes.

## **East Yorkshire**

See the coastline come to life with splashes of colour at the annual <u>Bridlington Kite Festival 2023</u>, set to take place on 20<sup>th</sup> & 21<sup>st</sup> May. Watch kites of all shapes and sizes, including some of the world's largest inflatable kites, paint the skies above the dramatic cliffs of the East Yorkshire coast. As well as professional demonstrations, for those wanting to get a little closer to the action, visitors can have a go with kites available for loan during supervised sessions.

**Book with England's Coast:** Stay nearby at <u>Waves and Wolds</u> in the postcard-perfect village of Sewerby. Waves and Wolds is a cosy and comfortable bungalow offering a large garden space for sundown drinks and alfresco dining. Just a five-minute walk will take you to views of beautiful chalk cliffs, seabird colonies, lighthouses, and beaches.

# **Bournemouth, Christchurch and Poole**

Head down to Bournemouth for three days of unrivalled local produce at <u>Poole Seafood Festival 2023</u> (dates TBC). Tempt your taste buds with some of the south coast's finest seafood, local artisan burgers and pizzas as well as a spectacular line up of live music. Indulge in the height of luxury at the champagne and oyster bar, or grab a refreshing local ale, cider or wine at the onsite bar. Once your stomach is satisfied, weave your way through themed clothing stalls, jewellery, art and accessories stalls and support the local business' delights on offer.

**Book with England's Coast:** Make the most of the tranquillity of the water's edge with a stay at <u>Bournemouth Beach Lodges</u>. Located only a few steps away from the soft sand and lapping waves, the uninterrupted views of the glistening water right from your window is the definition of serenity.

## Isle of Wight

Hop across to the Isle of Wight for one of its annual highlights. Set to be particularly special, 2023 will see <a href="Shanklin Town Regatta">Shanklin Town Regatta</a> celebrating 170 years. This event brings the whole town and its visitors together for a day bursting with entertainment and excitement for everyone. Beach sports and swimming events for all ages will run throughout the day with festivities continuing into the evening with a barbeque, music, and firework display; a perfect day out for the entire family.

With two acres of woodland gardens, surrounding National Trust grounds and coastal walks right on the doorstep, there is plenty to be explored.

#### **West Sussex**

Head to the south coast in <u>West Sussex</u> where the buzzing seaside town of Worthing will host its annual <u>PRIDE</u> event in the seafront Steyne Gardens from 7-8<sup>th</sup> July 2023, celebrating diversity, equality and inclusivity. There'll be a vibrant two-day programme of live music and amazing artists, entertainment, food and drink and – of course – wonderful parades and costumes galore, to rival nearby Brighton's events. The main event, the Parade on the Prom, will start at 11am on 8<sup>th</sup> July.

**Book with England's Coast:** Just steps away from Steyne Park and the beach, stay at the independent, family-run <a href="Ardington Hotel">Ardington Hotel</a>, a contemporary beachside hotel with 45 stylish bedrooms and an award-winning restaurant.

### **North York Moors National Park**

What better way to fully immerse yourself in the wonders of nature than gazing in awe at the Milky Way and marvelling at the millions of stars in the night sky? From the 10<sup>th</sup>-26<sup>th</sup> February, <u>Dark Skies Festival</u> will be back for its 8<sup>th</sup> year. Heighten your senses and discover the beauty of the world at night through activities such as night runs, zip wires, astrophotography workshops, stargazing safaris, children's trails and mindfulness experiences.

**Book with England's Coast:** Looking for a perfectly romantic end to your night under the stars? Nestled in a pocket of private woodland nearby stand three Whitby Log Cabins spread across four acres. They are laid out so that each unit has privacy and its own outside space offering a sense of total seclusion.

### **Dartmouth**

The beautiful town of Dartmouth on the banks of the picturesque River Dart boasts a packed calendar of festivals and events throughout the year, but one of the annual highlights is <u>Dartmouth Shakespeare Week</u> by the Inn Theatre Company: enjoy spectacular performances of the Bard's best plays against the stunning backdrop of Dartmouth Castle (July 2023, dates TBC).

**Book with England's Coast:** Stay nearby at <u>The Old Bakery</u>, a modernised Townhouse situated in Dartmouth Town centre. With popular restaurants, cafes and amenities just a stone's throw from its front door, this property truly is perfect for families, couples and friends wanting to escape to a hidden gem.
